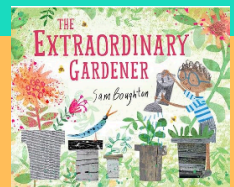

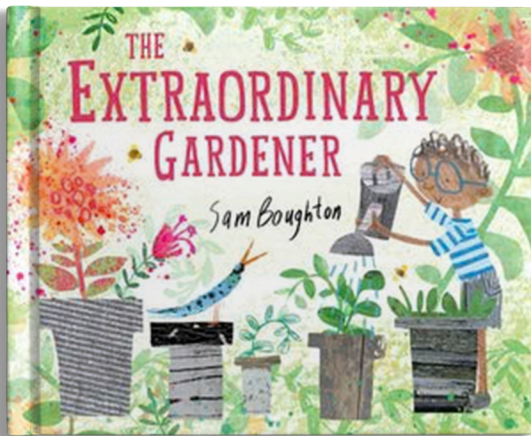

Program Details:
